Broadband

Final costings for broadband delivery to Bainton are awaited. Cllr Allen reported that 13 residents had now indicated an interest in the service. It is possible that grants may be available to support this provision.

Website

Allotments

It was reported that the hedge adjacent to the allotments has become overgrown and requires attention.

Road resurfacing - Bainton

The Dragon patcher has carried out some resurfacing, and is expected shortly to complete the outstanding work. Road drains were cleared on 12th July.

Strategic Railfreight interchange

There are proposals to construct a strategic ralfreight interchange near Ardley, which could affect Stoke Lyne. It was agreed that the Council would be interested in meeting jointly with other affected parishes as the proposals develop.

Overgrown vegetation

The Hook Norton Brewery has cut back vegetation by the public house.

Speeding traffic

The clerk was asked to ask OCC for advice about traffic speeding through the 30mph area at the top of the village, and traffic rat running through the village if there is a traffic build up locally (usually at peak times).
